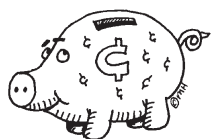
## Second Sunday of Lent

A theme that runs through literature—that of returning to one's home, one's kingdom, and return followed by righting of wrongs that took place during the character's absence—is seen in today's reading. Jesus returns to what is rightfully his, to a kingdom temporarily wrested from him, returning and putting to an end wrongful usurpation. Lest there be any mistake about his identity, his right to expel the intruder, Jesus on the mountain allows himself to be recognized by three of his followers in all his glory so that later on they would remember and understand that it was not for lack of power that he falls into the hands of his enemies. The mountain experience, the Transfiguration, gives us a hint of what it will mean to be with Jesus when he fully recaptures his kingdom.

Our annual Pennies from Heaven collection has begun for the Lenten Season.

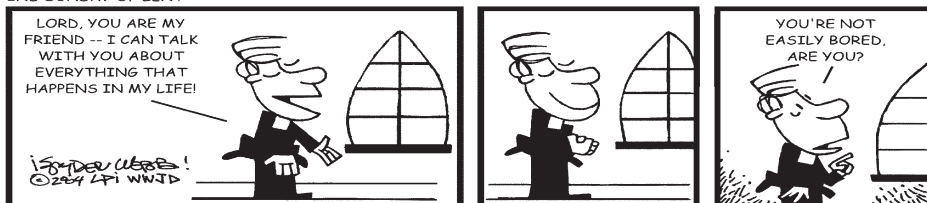
Remember, if you are giving up meals out, candy, or any other kind of food, put the money that you saved aside and bring it in for this special collection!
